Gun Crew Uniforms

H.M.S. Badger often carries 2 cannon when we participate in various events, and when our Gun Crew fires a salute it's always a crowd-pleaser. Gunners of the 1812-1815 period wore a red vest, and here is one theory as to why...

Gun Crews on rated Royal Navy warships were hand picked and primarily trained to man and maintain the ship's guns, and in addition, trained by Royal Marines on the use of small arms such as the flintlock pistol, musket, and blunderbus. A Royal Marine section on each warship was detailed to assist gunners during fighting action and landing and boarding parties.

Royal Navy gunnery was considered the most devastatingly accurate of any world navy of the period. It is thought that the gunners therefore adopted a vest (matching the red of the Royal Marine tunics) to distinguish themselves as Royal Navy gunners.
